Initial		Task	Hazards	Controls		
	Lift	ing heavy objects	Injury to body parts	Follow proper protocol when lifting or moving heavy equipment. Make sure hands and feet are not in the way when equipment is moved.		
	Dealing With Sharp Objects		Eye Injury	Wear safety goggles.		
			Minimal or Serious cuts	Wear gloves and do not face tool toward body.		
	Soldering Electrical Components and Heat Shrinking		Burning hands, face or arms Respirator problems	Wear long-sleeved clothing and have a spotter on site.		
			Respirator problems	Wear a face mask or take breaks when soldering.		
	Drilling and Welding		Deep cuts	Wear thick gloves and face power tools away from your body. Make sure you are capable of handling the object.		
			Serious 2nd or 3rd Degree Burns	Wear a welding mask, heavy gloves, long sleeves, heavy shoes and pants.		
Managing and Operating the ROV						
Initial		Task	Hazards	Controls		
		Launching and Retrieving the ROV	Hand Injury	When retrieving the ROV, grab firmly on the frame of the ROV.		
			ROV Damage	When launching the vehicle, carefully insert it into the water,- do not drop it in. When lifting the ROV lift straight up from the water with both hands on the frame of the ROV.		



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	Transporting the ROV	Dropping and Damaging ROV	Bring containers to secure the ROV when transporting it. Make sure to put a lid on it and have a tight fit to limit chances of damage.
		Damage or Destruction When Packing and Unpacking the ROV	Carefully place the ROV into a container, using multiple people. Make sure that wires are neatly wrapped up.
	Lifting the ROV	Back Injury	When lifting a heavy object make sure that you are lifting something that you know you can lift and lift with multiple people helping to avoid back injury.
		Hand Injury	When lifting a heavy object, either secure your hands onto the object or take breaks in the process.
	Connecting tether	Tether pulling	Ensure tether is securely placed in tether restraint.
		Tripping over tether	Use proper coiling procedures for tether
	Operating the ROV poolside	Electrocution	Follow deck commands when preparing to launch ROV
		Slipping, drowning	Wear floatation devices when launching the ROV or on the deck of the pool
